Meeting called to order by Mayor Charles R. Devinney.

Members present: Mayor Charles R. Devinney, Commissioners Ethel F. Burns, Clinton E. Bryan, Gene T. Brooks, and Max G. Cotten.

Other Staff present: Town Attorney Paul Messick, Chief of Police Jerry Clapp and Town Manager Hugh Montgomery.

Mayor Devinney announced to the Commissioners and those attending the meeting that Mayor Pro Tem Cassie Wasko had died today. TRIANGLE J COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENT

Request by Town Manager to make payment to Triangle J Council of Governments for the Towns share of the Jordan Lake Nutrient Response Modeling Project.

Motion was made by Commissioner Brooks and seconded by Commissioner Bryan to authorize the Town Manager to make payment to Triangle J Council of Governments for the Town of Pittsboro's proportionate share of the Jordan Lake Nutrient Response Modeling Project in the amount of \$3,484.00.

Establish Public Hearing - Stop Signs to be installed at various intersections on local streets.

Commissioner Cotten and Chief Clapp introduced their suggestions for intersections that would assist toward the Commissioners efforts to make our town maintained street safer for pedestrians and slow traffic down in our neighborhoods. Discussion ensued from the Commissioners about enforcement of existing traffic laws with special attention to be made on Hillsborough Street where the "no left turn" onto Salisbury Street is being ignored by the motoring public.

A motion was made by Commissioner Cotten and seconded by Commissioner Brooks to establish July 24th, 2000 as the date for a public hearing on the installation of stop signs to be located at the following intersections:

Hanks and Credle Streets; Hillcrest and Park; West Salisbury and Fayetteville Street; West Salisbury and Johnson Street; East Salisbury and Masonic Street; East Salisbury and Small Street.
