



**RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING “BUSHEL & A  
PECK DAY” FOR KENZIE SCOGGINS**

**WHEREAS**, Kenzie Wrenn Scoggins, 5 years old, resident of Siler City, North Carolina, on December 8, 2021 was diagnosed with an aggressive brain tumor called Childhood Diffuse Intrinsic Pontine Glioma (DIPG); and

**WHEREAS**, DIPG forms within the brain stem, is inoperable, and currently has no cure with a statistic of having a 1% chance of living 5 years. As the tumor progresses, it puts pressure on the nerves that control the body’s vital functions which slowly causes paralysis, yet those suffering remain fully aware; and

**WHEREAS**, Kenzie Wrenn Scoggins underwent numerous treatments, tests, and appointments over nine months; and

**WHEREAS**, Kenzie Wrenn Scoggins passed away on September 18, 2022, in the comfort of her home; and

**WHEREAS**, annually on December 17 will be recognized as a day of remembrance as “Bushel & A Peck Day”, and to raise awareness of DIPG.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Board of Commissioners for the Town of Pittsboro recognizes December 17, annually, for “Bushel & A Peck Day”.
